Stations of the Cross: Fridays at 7 pm.

Lenten Study with Fr. Shawn: During Lent we will be journeying through the New Testament to see how the Eucharist is found there explicitly. Remaining classes will take place on March 23 and 30. Standards for Fast and Abstinence: Every person 14 years of age or older must abstain from meat (and items made with meat) on Fridays of Lent and Good Friday. Every person age 18-59 must fast on Good Friday. To fast means only one complete meatless meal can be taken. Other smaller meals, if taken at all, cannot equal in quantity to the one meal.

Day 1: Depart aboard a deluxe motorcoach as we head to upstate New York & Canada. En route we'll stop at NATIONAL SHRINE OF THE NORTH AMERICAN MARTYRS. This afternoon visit the SAINT MARIANNE COPE SHRINE in Syracuse, NY to learn about the inspiring life of this beloved Catholic saint. The Shrine features exhibits and artifacts that showcase her legacy of selflessness, compassion, and dedication to helping those in need. 



Eucharistic Miracle of LUDBREG



CROATIA, 1411

During Mass at Ludbreg in 1411, a priest doubted whether the Body and Blood of Christ were really present in the Eucharistic species. Immediately after being consecrated, the wine turned into Blood. Today the precious relic of the miraculous Blood still draws thousands of the faithful, and every year at the beginning of September the so-called "Sveta Nedilja -Holy Sunday" is celebrated for an entire week in honor of the Eucharistic miracle that occurred in 1411.



n 1411 at Ludbreg, in the chapel of the Count Batthyany's castle, a priest was celebrating Mass. During the consecration of the wine, the priest doubted the truth of transubstantiation and so the wine in the chalice turned into Blood. Not knowing what to do, the priest embedded this relic in the wall behind the main altar. The workman who did the job was sworn to silence. The priest also kept it secret and revealed it only at the time of his death. After the priest's revelation, news quickly spread and people started coming on pilgrimage to Ludbreg. The Holy See later had the relic of the miracle brought to Rome, where it remained for several years. The people of Ludbreg and the surrounding area, however, continued to make pilgrimages to the castle chapel. In the early 1500s, during the pontificate of Pope Julius II, a commission was

convened in Ludbreg to investigate the facts connected with the Eucharistic miracle. Many people testified that they had received marvelous cures while praying in the relic's presence. On April 14, 1513, Pope Leo X published a Bull permitting veneration of the holy relic which he himself had carried in procession several times through the streets of Rome. The relic was later returned to Croatia.

In the 18th century, northern Croatia was ravaged by the plague. The people turned to God to call upon his help, and the Croatian Parliament did the same. During the session held on December 15, 1739 in the city of Varazdin, they vowed to build a chapel at Ludbreg in honor of the miracle, if the plague ended. The plague was averted, but the promised

vow was only fulfilled in 1994, when democracy was restored in Croatia. In 2005 in the votive chapel, the artist Marijan Jakubin painted a large fresco of the Last Supper in which Croatian saints and blesseds were drawn in place of the Apostles. St. John was replaced with Blessed Ivan Merz, who was included among the 18 most important Eucharistic saints in the Church's history during the Synod of Bishops on the Eucharist held in Rome in 2005. In the painting, Christ is holding in his hand a monstrance containing the relic of the Eucharistic miracle.





Disciples 4 Life (D4L) FAQ's

Is it the right time for you to go on a retreat?

Luke 14-20: Jesus replied: "A certain man was preparing a great banquet and invited many guests. At the time of the banquet, he sent his servant to tell those who had been invited, 'Come, for everything is now ready.' "But they all alike began to make excuses. The first said, 'I have just bought a field, and I must go and see it. Please excuse me.' "Another said, 'I have just bought five yoke of oxen, and I'm on my way to try them out. Please excuse me.' "Still another said, 'I just got married, so I can't come.'

A learned interpretation on the story Jesus is telling is that one man was occupied with business deals – he's the man of power. Another was excited about his new purchase – he's the man of possessions. And a third was engrossed in the raptures of a newlywed – he's the man of pleasure. The teaching is that we all, at times, put God and our faith behind other worldly initiatives. The D4L retreat is offered as an opportunity for you to say "yes" to the invitation. There are always conflicting schedules, issues, priorities, but only you can answer the question: "Is this the time for you to devote a weekend away for renewal of your faith, for your benefit, for your family and for the community? It may take a little bit of courage to evaluate that question honestly, so you are encouraged to pray on the invitation with an open and listening heart.

What can I expect, and what is expected of me on the retreat?

You should expect an uplifting time away dedicated to coming closer to Christ. Hundreds of people have gone before you, and overwhelmingly have assessed the weekend as ranging from extremely beneficial to life-changing. You will be in the company of caring individuals and you will likely experience a weekend of good fellowship, food and friends. There will be time to reflect individually on your spirituality, as well as hear from the retreat team about their faith journey. There is no requirement for you to share your thoughts or experiences with others in a group setting.
