

Dear Fr. Shawn,

I am writing on behalf of a non-profit organization that I have just begun. I would like to share about this new and exciting ministry and invite you to join me on this important mission.

In December of 2021, I decided to begin pursuing a calling that had been forming deep within me. This calling was one of forming an organization/ministry solely dedicated to youth here in Connecticut. One that would focus on bringing young people to Jesus by helping them grow in their faith by diving deeper into their spirituality, while also helping them develop the tools and skills to be leaders in their respected communities. As I pursued this calling, I looked to the Blessed Mother to be my consolation & guidance. There became an ever-growing desire to bring the Blessed Mother into the fold and have Her be the focal point of it all. For there is truly no greater way for young people to grow in their faith and love of Jesus then for them to come to grow in their knowledge, love, and devotion for Our Lady. As St. Louis de Montfort says, "To Jesus through Mary!" As my personal discernment and prayer grew, the name for this ministry came about, CREW – Leaders For Mary.

Almost a year later, that calling to start a ministry materialized into a non-profit Catholic apostolate! This is a fancy way of saying a lay ministry. CREW – Leaders For Mary (CLFM) focuses primarily on improving, teaching, and informing high school teens to follow Jesus Christ through the virtues of the Blessed Virgin Mary. CLFM empowers the young urban Church to foster authentic, mission-minded Catholic community by imitating the virtues of Our Lady. Our vision is to see a young urban church taking ownership of its faith & spirituality. Through bi-weekly meetings and quarterly retreats during the year, teens will be developed into leaders, grow deeper in their spirituality, and gain a likeminded catholic community that supports their beliefs and values.

It has been an incredible experience to begin empowering young people to be leaders in the Church! I am truly humbled by how well instilling the virtues of Our Lady, that of purity, obedience, and humility, has helped transform the lives of some of our teens. I am filled with joy to see how this ministry has begun fostering authentic Catholic community amongst the teens.

In order to be successful, we will need others to join us on the mission through their prayers, networking, and financial support. I would love the opportunity to share with you my mission with CLFM and the possible ways that you could support the mission. I will be contacting you within the next few days and I look forward to hearing from you!

One hundred percent of students graduate from high school, 99% go on to attend college or post-secondary school — outcomes that far exceed Bridgeport charter and public schools.

SERMON BY FR. SHAWN W. JORDAN

NDREW SAID TO HIM, "There is a

boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good is that for so many?"

Andrew's seemingly dismissive question to Jesus points out how we often see so little, but Jesus takes what appears small and insignificant in our life and multiplies it exponentially with His blessings.

This principle applies directly to the 2023 Bishop's Appeal. St. Marguerite's goal is \$65,700, and we are at a little over 60% of the goal. We thank everyone who has given to the Appeal already and those who have made additional gifts. The monies raised through the Appeal affects real people directly. When we give to the Appeal, we are not so much giving to programs as we are helping those who are in need throughout the diocese, including the northern area where we live.

The larger objective of the Bishop's Appeal each year goes beyond just giving funds. The most important point is where we ask ourselves, "How grateful am I for the blessings and gifts that God has given me? How do I show I am thankful for all that I have and the people who are in my life?" As we know, Jesus never kept anything for Himself. He gave everything away for our benefit, and He still benefits us in this way. We often don't think about what we have in life and who are the most important people God has placed in our path. While we cannot match God's generosity and giving in each of our lives personally, He does ask that what have received, we should pass some of that on to others as a reflection of who God is in our life.

The Bishop's Appeal helps many people in our diocese, and those ways are listed on the diocesan and parish websites. To highlight just a few examples of how the Appeal benefits others:

Six seminarians will be ordained in June. The
Appeal funds their seminary studies and
pastoral training. We need priests to celebrate
the sacraments for our families and to provide
spiritual and moral guidance. This is one way
we support the next generation of priests for the
Church.

- The cost of food has risen greatly, as we are all aware. The Appeal funds the Morning Glory Breakfast Program and stocks food pantries.
- Since the lockdown, we have seen, even at St.
 Marguerite's, an increase in people dealing with
 mental health issues. The Appeal funds ways
 people dealing with mental challenges can find
 stability in their life, learn proper social skills,
 find jobs, and obtain housing.
- The Appeal also funds the Family Loan
 Programs for the working poor and provides
 mentorship programs for people to learn job or
 vocational skills or advance in their current
 career.
- We are a Church that is pro-life. The Appeal provides counseling for women dealing with atrisk pregnancies who think abortion is the only solution. The Appeal also funds adoption programs.
- Finally, the Bishop's Appeal helps some of our poorer parishes throughout the diocese who have been badly effected since the lockdown and have not been able to return to parishioner participation levels they experienced before COVID.

St. Teresa of Calcutta always used to say, "When I see a poor person, I see Jesus in disguise." When we give to the Appeal, we become Jesus in disguise for a person we will likely never meet in this life, but we will in the next. Being generous and thankful never leaves us feeling less, it only expands our heart and life in God. What would have happened if the boy in the abovementioned quote decided he did not want to share his bread and fish with Jesus and just keep them to himself?



Eucharistic Miracle of

LES ULMES


FRANCE, 1668

In the Eucharistic miracle of Les Ulmes, it was during the exposition of the Blessed Sacrament for public adoration, that, in place of the Host, there appeared the shape of a man with light-brown hair falling over his back, a luminous face, the hands crossed one over the other, and a white tunic covering the body. After close examination the Bishop authorized devotion to this Eucharistic Miracle. Even today in the church, the recess which contained the miraculous Host for more than 130 years can be seen. The Host was devoutly consumed by the Vicar of Puy Notre Dame during the French Revolution, for fear that this Blessed Sacrament would be profaned.









n June 2 1668, Saturday of the Octave of Corpus Christi, in the small Church of Les Ulmes, the Blessed Sacrament was exposed for public adoration. The Pastor of the Church, Nicolas Nezan, began to incense the monstrance. While the hymn Pange Lingua was being sung, "and having reached the stanza 'Verbum caro Panem verum', the shape of a man appeared in the monstrance in place of the Host. He appeared to have light brown hair that fell over his back, a luminous face, the hands crossed one over the other, and the body covered by a white tunic. This apparition lasted for more than a quarter of an hour, whether on the tabernacle where the Blessed Sacrament was exposed, or on the altar where the priest had moved the Blessed Sacrament to allow a closer look to all those present."

On June 13, the pastor immediately sent a message of what had occurred to his Bishop, Henry Arnauld, who quickly ordered an inquiry. On June 25 the pastoral letter was published containing the "faithful description" of the marvel. Among the several works which followed and which sought the objective description contained in the letter, we remember that of the Dominican Father Gonet, who describes the event in Volume VIII of his work Clypeus Theologiae, published for the first time in 1669 by the French editor Bertier.

The Bishop ordered this fact to be diffused widely therefore three engravings were immediately commissioned: one of Edelynck which is still in Paris, of optimal quality; one of Jean Bidault di Saumur and lastly, one by the

editor Ernoudi Parigi. At the end of the 18th century in the parish of Les Ulmes, every year the anniversary of the apparition was solemnly celebrated. In 1901 the International Eucharistic Congress of Angers was celebrated in this parish and in July 1933, during the National Eucharistic Congress, a complete session of study was dedicated to the miracle of 1668. Even today in the church, the recess can be seen that for 130 years contained the miraculous Host. The Sacred Species was devoutly consumed during the French Revolution by the Vicar of Puy-Notre-Dame who was afraid that the Precious Sacrament would be profaned.
