# ST. MARGUERITE BOURGEOYS - How did the church get her name?



Sister Jane Scanlon

"For what is there on earth that I desire, What can it give or take from me. Or whom in Heaven, doth my spirit seek O God! but Thee?"

St. Marguerite

Apparently, there were several names that were considered. Including St. Rita and St. Therese. Scanlon, member Sister Jane of Marguerite's Congregation of Notre Dame, on April 19, 1982, wrote a letter to Bishop Curtis of the Diocese of Bridgeport stating that she had "an inspiration" and asked "Would you consider putting the new parish in Brookfield under the patronage of Saint Marguerite?". In this letter, which is available in our church archives, she wrote "Marguerite was a North American pioneer and a staunch advocate of local Christian community. She was herself, and counselled her sisters to be, 'filles de paroisse' [parish girls]. The local parish Church was the locus of their spirituality. Although Marguerite apostolic served in the new colony of Montreal over three hundred years ago, I believe her vision and spirituality in its core is contemporary". According to an interview with her not long ago, she said that as co-founder her intention was to expand the work of the blessed woman in education and service. What better way to do this than name a church after her, in fact the only church in North America.

Sister Jane was educated at an Augustinian elementary school, St. Nicholas of Tolentine Catholic Academy on Long Island, NY. It was there that she met the Sisters of the Congregation of Notre Dame, St. Marguerite's religious community. Jane went to Jean Baptiste High School, a Catholic community rooted in the spirit of St. Marguerite Bourgeoys. Sister Jane joined the CND community and pursued her calling under the banner of St. Marguerite. In service to her patroness and as a member of the CND community, she was called in 1982 from teaching chemistry in Illinois to pastoral service at the new church in Brookfield, alongside Fr. Hossan, its founding pastor.


