# ST. MARGUERITE BOURGEOYS THE CHURCH AND THE SAINT A Pilgrimage Through and With St. Marguerite

Marguerite was born in 1620 in Troyes, France. In her teens she thought that she wanted to be part of the Carmelite community. However, unlike the Carmelites, she did not want to be a cloistered nun but instead work within the community serving those in need. She joined an association of lay teachers known as the External Congregation of Our Lady. This association was sponsored and guided by the members of the Congregation of Notre Dame/Canonesses of St. Augustine, who had a house in Troyes. Note: A habit was not required of these lay members, but Marguerite had made a vow of chastity and poverty, thus her clothing was chosen in accordance with these virtues.

"Members of this association lived at home and dedicated themselves to the work of teaching girls. It was among the first congregations of women religious whose members were not bound by the rules of enclosure so that they could teach poor children who were unable to attend convent schools. As time passed, Marguerite's life project became clearer. She felt called to imitate the life of the Blessed Virgin and to form a religious community. In this way, she was inspired by the spirituality of Mary, especially in the narratives of the Visitation and of Pentecost.

In the Visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth, the way that Mary goes toward the other and is present with the other was the source of inspiration [for Marguerite]. This story is at the heart of the spirituality of service, presence, and hospitality of the Congregation.

The narrative of Pentecost refers to the life of Mary among the apostles, in the first Christian community. From it emerges the sense of community, participation in the Church and in the transformation of society, as well as the invitation to use the gifts received for the service of others.

Note: from this focus on community, we understand why there are children in her images. These texts from the Gospel, and the reflections that they bring, are at the center of the spiritual rooting of Marguerite herself, ... and of the associates of the Congrégation de Notre-Dame".
