ST. MARGUERITE BOURGEOYS -

THE CHURCH AND THE SAINT A Pilgrimage Through and With St. Marguerite



This was her pleasure, to cultivate young minds and imbue them with the love of virtue and religion, with sentiments of filial devotion towards that August Mother of God, to whom she was herself so peculiarly devoted.

("Pearl", p.50)

When she arrived in Ville-Marie, she found that few children survived to school age. She helped the remarkable Jeanne Mance, who ran the hospital, to change this tragedy. One of the first things she did was restore the Cross on Mount Royal after it was destroyed by hostile natives. She also undertook the construction of a chapel dedicated to Notre-Dame de Bon Secours.

In 1658, in a stone stable some 36 feet long which had been given to her by the governor for her use, she opened the first school in Montreal. Here she lived and taught and kept the young emigrant girls who came to seek a home in the new colony. In her reminiscences she writes, "Here, Huron, Iroquois and French Canadian met together, and together [spoke] the names of Jesus, of Mary, of faith, hope and love." ("Pearl of Troyes", p.52)

She also organized a convent patterned after the one which she had lived in while in Troyes. Her greatest desire had been to create a Congregation of itinerate sisters who would live in huts within the community of their students, much like she had done in Troyes. She never received permission to do this until many decades later. It was here, within this new Congregation, that a young Iroquois mother brought her nine-month-old daughter, sadly neglected. to Sister Marguerite to care for in their community. Sister Marguerite began to give catechesismand to assist pastorally in nearby parishes

As we reflect on the beginnings of Sister Marguerite's life in New Canada, we are struck with the understanding of her devotion to conversion, education, and charity toward all souls. We as parishioners of St. Marguerite church, in our formation classes and adult education, in our acts of charity, our many forms of outreach and the love and compassion that we share with our fellow parishioners are certainly inspired by Marguerite's patronage, prayers and protection of us all.

Dear Friends in Christ,

In every age of the Church, the Lord has provided faithful shepherds—men who have offered their lives so that others might encounter Christ in the sacraments. Over the decades, our priests have baptized our children, witnessed our marriages, comforted us in times of grief, and nourished us with the Eucharist.

Our parish priests have been true spiritual fathers, and as they age, it is our duty to care for them with the same generosity they have shown us. To meet this responsibility, our diocese has established the St. John Vianney Trust, an independent non-profit with the sole mission of caring for our senior and infirm priests in the Diocese of Bridgeport.

It is important to recognize that retirement does not end a priest's ministry. Senior priests continue to celebrate Mass, hear confessions, and offer pastoral guidance wherever they are needed. Our diocese has more than 70 priests past retirement age, a number that is projected surpass 100 priests within 15 years.

Despite dramatically rising healthcare costs, our diocese is committed to providing care for our older priests, but we need more financial resources to do so. Your generosity will ensure that these faithful men, many of whom serve well into their eighties, can continue to minister and live their remaining years with dignity

Scripture reminds us to "honor your father and mother" (Ex 20:12), and that "kindness to a father will not be forgotten" (Sir 3:14). This principle certainly applies to our earthly fathers, but it is equally true of our spiritual fathers—our parish priests. And so I invite you to give generously to the Faith of Our Fathers campaign.

Finally, please join me in praying for our beloved priests who have passed away, as well as those who are in the autumn of life. As their strength wanes, our support must grow stronger.

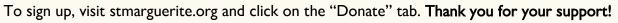
