

A Pilgrimage Through and With St. Marguerite

Revelations 12 (NAB)

1 A great sign appeared in the sky, a woman clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars. 2 She was with child and wailed aloud in pain as she labored to give birth. 3 Then another sign appeared in the sky; it was a huge red dragon, with seven heads and ten horns, and on its heads were seven diadems... 5 She gave birth to a son, a male child, destined to rule all the nations with an iron rod. Her child was caught up to God and his throne...

7 Then war broke out in heaven; Michael and his angels battled against the dragon. The dragon and its angels fought back, 8 but they did not prevail and there was no longer any place for them in heaven. 9 The huge dragon, the ancient serpent, who is called the Devil and Satan, who deceived the whole world, was thrown down to earth, and its angels were thrown down with it.

On our rear nave wall, and opposite to the Holy family window is this window, "Queen of Heaven", depicting the crowned Queen Mother holding Jesus. Also depicted are St. Benedict (6th century monk, brown habit), who promoted his Rule for monastic life, "Ora et Labora", and St. Augustine of Hippo (4th century bishop, red robes). Augustine was the author of "Confessions" in which he wrote "You have made us for yourself, O Lord, and our heart is restless until it rests in you."

Notice in the bottom right corner of the window St. Augustine holds a framed painting depicting Archangel Michael and his angels casting out Satan and his minions.

From what is now understood, Fr. Audette designed the coat of arms at the bottom of this window, but that has not been confirmed. The double-barred "Patriarchal" cross symbolizes both St. Benedict and St. Augustine as Western church Patriarchs. Both of the saints hold their shepherd staff or bishop's crozier associated with their particular orders and rules.

In the words of St. Benedict XVI in the 3rd part of his work, *The Spirit of the Liturgy*, "...let us not forget the glorious art of Gothic stained glass! The windows of the Gothic cathedrals keep out the garishness of the light outside, while concentrating that light and using it so that the whole history of God in relation to man, from creation to the Second Coming, shines through."
