15 FEBRUARY 2026 - SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Ash Wednesday is February 18. This day marks the start of Lent, the 40-day period of prayer and fasting before Easter. The blessing and imposition of ashes will take place at the 8:30 am Mass.

Stations of the Cross: Fridays of Lent at 7 pm


Catholics are obligated to practice **Fasting and Abstinence** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. Fasting for adults, ages 18-59, consists of having one full meal, as well as two small meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Abstinence for individuals, ages 14+, refers to the absence of meat.

Office is Closed on Monday, February 16 in observance of Presidents' Day.

Our Diocese is hosting **Called By Name** on February 21-22. Parishioners will be invited to submit the name and contact information of young men (15-30s) who show promise in their faith and may be open to the priesthood. Cards will be provided at Mass. Dear Friends in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in our Lord Jesus Christ.

As your bishop, one of my greatest responsibilities is to ensure that the faithful of our diocese will always have good and holy priests to shepherd them. And yet, priestly vocations are never the work of one person alone. They arise when the whole Church prays for, encourages, and calls forth those men whom God has chosen.

For this reason, our diocese is once again hosting **Called by Name on February 21-22**, during which I ask you to help me identify young men who demonstrate faith, generosity, and leadership.

You may recall this initiative from last year, through which the Vocation Office received over 300 submissions. We have seen tremendous fruit from this effort, with more men in discernment groups, attending events, and being accompanied by our Vocation Team.

In fact, I am pleased to report that we accepted **10 new seminarians this past fall, bringing our total number of seminarians for the diocese to 38. We also have at least 4 men in application for the next academic year.** I thank you for your prayers, support, and participation in last year's Called By Name campaign, which have all meaningfully contributed to this growth. But our work is not done!

To continue this momentum, we want to connect with even more incredible young men this year! I invite you to nominate young men in your community who live their faith with integrity, serve generously, and show potential for Christian leadership. Your nomination may be the spark that helps a young man open his heart more fully to God's call. Don't hesitate to nominate a young man again, we want to continue to support him.

You may use the cards provided at Mass or submit names online at bridgeportpriest.org. For those under 18, please include their parents' names as well.

This effort is dear to my heart. With your thoughtful participation, I am confident the Lord will raise up many new shepherds for his people. May this campaign bear lasting fruit for our diocese and for the salvation of souls.

A Pilgrimage Through and With St. Marguerite

The Silent Miracle of the Altar

“The hosts that are not consumed during Mass are reserved in the tabernacle, that small, sacred ‘dwelling’ you’ll find in our churches—marked by the burning lamp that silently proclaims: *Christ is truly here.*” The Silent Miracle

The exquisite tabernacle on the altar at St. Marguerite features the coronation of Mary, with Jesus and God and the Holy Spirit participating in placing the crown upon her head. This is not the original tabernacle, but one installed in the late 1990s, after the marble pedestal was constructed to support it. Kneeling angels gracefully support the tabernacle, reminiscent of the original design that God meticulously instructed Moses to create in Exodus 25:22 (RSV). God explains to Moses regarding the placement of the angels with their wings extended that it is “[t]here I will meet with you, and from above the mercy seat, from between the two cherubim that are upon the ark of the testimony, I will speak with you of all that I will give you in commandment for the people of Israel”. The mercy seat, mentioned again in Hebrews 9:5, has become a place of atonement for the Christian people through the most perfect tabernacle.

During daily mass this week, Fr. Shawn shared that the sacraments serve as the means through which God heals us today, much like how Jesus healed countless individuals in Galilee. He emphasized that the sacraments bind “the wounds so that we can continue moving forward in our pilgrimage with God walking beside us.” It is through these sacred rites that we receive the transmission of God’s grace. The Holy Eucharist is known as the Blessed Sacrament, where “in the Holy Eucharist, Christ is present wholly, body, blood, soul, and divinity, under the appearance of bread and wine.”

Saint Marguerite held a profound devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, which enabled her to guide her congregations closer to Jesus.
