22 FEBRUARY 2026 - FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

Lent is a 40-Day Period of Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving before Easter.

~ **Stations of the Cross**: at 7 pm in the Church, all Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.
~ Catholics are obligated to practice **Fasting and Abstinence** on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. **Fasting** for adults, ages 18-59, consists of having one full meal, as well as two small meals that together are not equal to a full meal. **Abstinence** for individuals, ages 14+, refers to the absence of meat.

Dear Friends in Christ,

Grace and peace to you in our Lord Jesus Christ.

As your bishop, one of my greatest responsibilities is to ensure that the faithful of our diocese will always have good and holy priests to shepherd them. And yet, priestly vocations are never the work of one person alone. They arise when the whole Church prays for, encourages, and calls forth those men whom God has chosen.

For this reason, our diocese is once again hosting **Called by Name on February 21-22**, during which I ask you to help me identify young men who demonstrate faith, generosity, and leadership.

You may recall this initiative from last year, through which the Vocation Office received over 300 submissions. We have seen tremendous fruit from this effort, with more men in discernment groups, attending events, and being accompanied by our Vocation Team.

We also have at least 4 men in application for the next academic year.** I thank you for your prayers, support, and participation in last year's Called By Name campaign, which have all meaningfully contributed to this growth. But our work is not done!

To continue this momentum, we want to connect with even more incredible young men this year! I invite you to nominate young men in your community who live their faith with integrity, serve generously, and show potential for Christian leadership. Your nomination may be the spark that helps a young man open his heart more fully to God's call. Don't hesitate to nominate a young man again, we want to continue to support him.

You may use the cards provided at Mass or submit names online at bridgeportpriest.org. For those under 18, please include their parents' names as well.

This effort is dear to my heart. With your thoughtful participation, I am confident the Lord will raise up many new shepherds for his people. May this campaign bear lasting fruit for our diocese and for the salvation of souls.

A Pilgrimage Through and With St. Marguerite

The Sacrament of Baptism

"Baptism is the sacrament that gives our souls the life of sanctifying grace by which we become children of God and heirs of heaven. It takes away original sin," as stated on our website under 'The Seven Sacraments'. The sacramental stained-glass windows of our sanctuary were donated by various families in the parish. This window located at the top left of the altar, indicating baptism, was donated by the McGetrick Family. These windows were installed in the church in the late 1990's as part of the transformation of the church initiated by Fr. Audette.

This particular design incorporates a shell with water flowing from it symbolizing washing away of original sin. The water is flowing into a baptismal font. The font has the 'Chi-Ro' symbol inscribed on the front. These are the two letters at the beginning of the Greek word for Christ, Χριστός (Christos). As we have seen in the other stained-glass windows that we have visited in the church, the use of red, blue and gold are also significant representing divine wisdom and the Blessed Mother, sacrifice and purification, and heavenly glory. The elliptical shapes surrounding the design also portray the array in which God has ordered the universe.



In chapter 6 of his letter to the Romans, Paul teaches us how important this rite of baptism is in our lives within the church community as the body of Christ.

3 Know you not that all we, who are baptized in Christ Jesus, are baptized in his death?

4 For we are buried together with him by baptism into death; that as Christ is risen from the dead by the glory of the Father, so we also may walk in newness of life.

5 For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also in the likeness of his resurrection.

6 Knowing this, that our old man is crucified with him, that the body of sin may be destroyed, to the end that we may serve sin no longer.
(Romans 6:3-6 DRA)

Saint Marguerite Bourgeoys was baptized on Good Friday, April 17, 1620, in the French city of Troyes. It was there that she received her catechesis from her devout mother and father, and through her beloved church of Saint-Jean. It was also there, as a member of the body of Christ, that she felt the enormous power of the Blessed Virgin calling her to begin her work of charity and teaching.



During medieval times, a separate building would be built to allow those in the church community to worship who had not yet been baptized called the Baptistry from the Greek word for bathing place. It was a separate building where the adults underwent catechesis culminating in full immersion in a baptismal font. The baptistry represented spiritual rebirth. One famous such structure is the Pisa Baptistery that is located in the same complex as its askew bell tower the Leaning Tower of Pisa.
